Headquarters Updates

The dues renewal period is underway for 2009-2010. Club dues payments are due to headquarters by July 1, 2009. All clubs were sent a packet the week of May 11 that contains all necessary forms to submit payment, including online payment instructions. Highlights this year:

- Regular, Retired/Unemployed, and Embarking members pay dues of \$52.00 per member; this is the last year of the dues increase approved by mail ballot action in December 2006.
- Club liability insurance remains \$1 per member in the United States, Canada, Puerto Rico and Guam.
- Soroptimist International dues have decreased to \$5.00 due to favorable exchange rates.
- Founders Pennies are 6 cents per each year of Soroptimist's existence, for a voluntary contribution of \$5.34 per member.
- Clubs can make additional voluntary contributions to the annual club campaign and disaster relief during the dues period as well.
- The mandatory convention fee for the 41st Biennial Convention in San Francisco, California, will be \$325, due March 15, 2010.

I pulled this article and picture from the April issue of SI Cannock and District's Soroptigram. She wants to raise funds this year for 4 charities – Citizens Advice Bureau in Cannock; Newlife Foundation; Alzheimer's Society and Young Carers, Cannock. They do really want to work on their friendship links and has assigned Lakhwinder Thompson to work with Joan. Lakhwinder will hopefully be in touch with us soon. Trish said Joan is home with carers coming to her house to look after her. Joan doesn't answer the phone or the door much anymore so no one knows how well she is doing.

"This year's Saturday of Service was again a huge success for the club. 18 members were in Cannock Town Centre on Saturday March 7th to raise awareness about Domestic Violence - particularly violence towards women - and to support Pathway, the local refuge for women victims of Domestic Violence. Throughout the day they accepted donations of toiletries - soap, toothbrushes, toothpaste, shampoo - from the people of Cannock which were taken to the refuge by the Soroptimist club's Pathway liaison Officer, Carole Holdcroft. They also sold almost £200.00 of goods on a bring and buy stall. There were people visiting the stands all day and everyone was interested in the work of Soroptimists and of the Pathway Project. Many took away information with them which will be used and then passed on to others. A number of people have arranged to donate household items which will be used to re-house the women from Pathway when they reach that point. All of this will aid SI Cannock in their work to continue to support the Pathway Project. Pat Ansell, Chairman of Cannock Chase District Council, Dennis Dixon Staffordshire County Councillor for Cannock and Tony Wright MP all visited during the day. They told President Lakhwinder Thompson and members how impressed they were by the work of the organisation and how important it is for women locally and globally to have a voice through Soroptimists."
