Report from NAR 2011 Fall District Meeting

The NAR 2011 Fall District IV Meeting hosted by SI Hanover that had been scheduled for October 29 was rescheduled to November 12 due to heavy snowfall on October 29. The meeting was attended by 6 of the originally planned 11 members from Harrisburg due to the snow and the subsequent rescheduled date which conflicted with our club's Bon Ton fundraiser event.



The meeting was called to order at 9:10 a.m. by District Director, Meada McAllister. There were a total of 21 attendees at the meeting; 5 first time attendees. Cheryl Swope, SI Hanover President, gave the invocation followed by the Pledge of Allegiance.

Region Updates were summarized by NAR Governor-Elect Deb Cooke. Some items reviewed included introduction of the NAR e-Bulletin; NAR Website is in process of being updated and is not available at this time; NAR Spring Conference is scheduled for April 27-29, 2012 in Albany; 2013 Spring Conference will be in Atlantic City, NJ.

Deb also noted that the Violet Richardson program will change from one of volunteerism to more focus on leadership. Starting next year, the emphasis will be shifting to Focus Groups in schools regarding Teen Dating Violence. More information to follow.

Deb announced that regarding Region Election, there are multiple candidates for Governor-Elect and Treasurer; however, there are no nominees for Region Secretary.

Meada announced that District IV has 14 clubs all in good standing; all clubs have more than the required 15 members. She noted some dates to remember: Ruby Award due to Region 1/15/12; Violet Richardson due to District Vice Chair 1/15/12; Women's Opportunity Award due to District Vice Chair 2/1/12 and Soroptimists Celebrating Success due at SIA headquarters 1/20/12.

A hand-out was provided outlining the Fact Sheets to be used for sharing success stories and best practices among clubs. Clubs may present Public Awareness Projects at the NAR Regional Meeting in Albany--to participate Fact Sheets must be submitted by March 1, 2012 to Mary Huber, NAR Public Awareness Chair.

The Soroptimist Drive for Dreams campaign was presented and discussed. Also, 2 general session workshops were held: New Member Education Workshop; Embracing Change Workshop.

The 2012 Fall District IV Meeting will be hosted by SI Fayette, October 27, 2012. Meeting was closed with Soroptimist Pledge.

Caitlin's Smiles reaches children in hospitals throughout Pennsylvania, Delaware, Ohio, Maryland and the District of Columbia.

Here are just a few of the statistics:

- Started at Penn State Children's Hospital
- Now they serve over 70 hospitals & pediatric clinics
- During the 1st year, they delivered about 10 bags per week
- Last year, they delivered 9,100 bags
